'New to New Delhi' is a comprehensive collection of information and insights into life within India's cosmopolitan capital city. While expatriates (including diplomats and corporate professionals), tend to have varied initial reactions and experiences, some questions and concerns remain common to all newcomers to Delhi. This book is an attempt to address them.

Often, the major hurdles of getting oriented and finding a home give way to smaller, but equally important dilemmas: How does one get a gas connection or even just fresh fish? Where can one admit a toddler into pre-school? What are the best ways of getting around in the ever-expanding, traffic-congested Delhi?

The following compilation has evolved through almost 15 years of dialogue with new entrants to the city and from conducting varied orientation, home search and settling in programs for expatriates looking to live and work in New Delhi. It aims to be a practical guide and to provide a smooth, companionable transition – from outsider to insider, from observer to belonger, from short-term resident to pucca Dilliwala.

New To New Delhi is divided into three segments :

- Orientation: A basic initiation into Delhi's history, cultural heritage, climate, people and mindsets. While this section provides only a macro-perspective, it indicates relevant agencies, publications and websites for readers seeking more extensive information.
- Home Search: Finding suitable residential and office space is the first priority of relocation. Here, we list the challenges of finding a home/office in Delhi, offer insights into the real estate market and recommend suitable locations.
- **3.** Settling In: Adapting to a new home is often a greater challenge than finding one! In this final segment, we provide information and advice on utility connections, furniture purchase, appliance rentals, house help, transportation, health care, security issues, schools, shopping and wellness.

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ABOUT DELHI




Such extreme contrasts are perhaps a manifestation of Delhi's unique ability to attract, accommodate and assimilate diversity and enrich its many layers of experience. Strategically located between the Aravali Hills and Yamuna River, the site of Delhi has been home to myriad kingdoms, dynasties and empires, for over 3000 years. By the end of the 13th century, the Khilji dynasty came to the throne of Delhi. Alauddin Khilji, who was concerned with building new fortifications against Mongol incursions, built a new capital, Siri. Not much remains of this second city of Delhi, except the walls. At some distance from the walls is the Hauz, or the water reservoir, which the Sultan built for the residents of the city. This is located in present day Hauz Khas in South Delhi.

Third Delhi

The advent of the Tughlaq Sultans to power in the early 14th century led to the foundation of Tughlaqabad. However, this third city of Delhi was abandoned after a few years, following the death of its founder Ghiyasuddin.

Fourth Delhi

The Sultan, Mohammed Tughlaq moved his capital to Daulatabad in the Deccan, but returned in a few years to build Jahanpanah. This became Delhi's fourth city and is situated between Qila Rai Pithora and Siri.

Fifth Delhi

Sultan Tughlaq's successor, Sultan Feroz Shah, created Firozabad, the fifth city of Delhi, on the banks of the Yamuna river. Firoz Shah Kotla, its

citadel, is the only surviving part of Seventh Delhi this city.

Sixth Delhi

Following the decline of the Tughlag dynasty and the invasion of Taimur the ruler of Samargand, in 1398. the Syed and Lodi dynasties ruled over a shrunken and weakened Sultanate for over a century. The last Lodi ruler was defeated in 1526 by Babur, a descendent of Taimur, who founded the Mughal dynasty. Babur's short reign was followed by that of his son Humayun. Humayun's reign saw an interregnum of 15 years while the Sur dynasty forced him into exile, and set up a strong state. Humayun founded a new citadel of Dinpanah, and Sher Shah Sur added a populous city to it, calling it Shergarh. This is today known as Purana Qila.

Though Humavun's son Akbar. moved the capital away to Agra, his grandson Shahjahan moved it back to Delhi, founding a grand city - Shahjahanabad. This seventh city of Delhi is today known as Old Delhi, which lies to the north of the capital's political and business centre. While the British came to rule Delhi early in the nineteenth century, the Mughal emperor continued to live in the Red Fort till 1857. In that year, there was an armed revolt against British rule, following which last emperor, Bahadur Shah Zafar, and his family were exiled.

New Delhi

In 1911 the British decided to move their capital from Calcutta to Delhi, and soon work began on a grand new capital city. This grew into New Delhi, the modern, tree-filled political hub of the city.

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



PEOPLE

Modern Delhi is a cornucopia of physical and ethnic diversity. A myriad faces, skin tones and accents can be found here and while this is largely due to internal migration from all parts of the country, much can be attributed to the history of foreign invasion and rule over past centuries.

The Pandavas of the epic Mahabharata are believed to have built Delhi's earliest city of Indraprastha around 1000 B.C. From the 8th century A.D., and right upto India's independence from colonial rule in 1947, Delhi was home to the Rajput dynasty, the Khilji clan, the Afghan rulers and Turkish Sultans, the Mughals and finally, the British empire. Each left an indelible mark on the fabric of Delhi and its demographics.

Following the Partition of India, a large number of Hindu refugees from Pakistan moved to the capital. They settled in 'refugee colonies' like Lajpat Nagar and Karol Bagh and prospered with time. In addition, Delhi's political and economic base accommodated bureaucrats, government servants and industrialists of varying stature.



In post-liberalized India, a range of job opportunities have attracted Indians from around the country to Delhi and the National Capital Region. Adding to this diverse mix, are the international delegates from over 136 embassies, diplomatic missions and United Nations offices plus an ever-growing number of international assignees working with multinational corporations, media houses and NGOs. It is estimated that over 400 overseas citizens relocate to New Delhi every month and reside for an average of three years in the city.


The middle and upper classes live mostly in gated colonies, surrounded by slums and 'Lal Doras' or urban villages, that accommodate the masses of domestic house help and lower income groups of the city. While Delhi is today a vibrant melting pot at one level, some localities continue to have a distinct demographic profile.

Pamposh Enclave	Home to many families from Kashmir
Janakpuri	A high concentration of Malayali and Tamilian families from South India
Chittaranjan Park	Populated mainly by Bengalis
Neeti Bagh	Allotted mainly to senior lawyers and advocates
Gulmohar Park	Allotted to journalists and media professionals
Nizamuddin East	Populated by artists, writers and lawyers
Defence Colony	Originally allotted to defense personnel
Vasant Vihar	Originally allotted to senior government officials and bureaucrats, it also includes smaller embassies, diplomatic missions and United Nations offices

Delhi remains a city of contradictions and negotiation between a conservative (and often orthodox) socio political patriarchal mindset and a younger, emerging generation of working professionals and nuclear families. Added to the mix are the large numbers of rural and semi-rural migrants that the city attracts, most of whom have little or no experience of modern urban life.



CLIMATE

CLIMATE AND SEASONS

The extreme contrasts and diversity in Delhi, are also manifested in its seasons! The long, very hot summers contrast with the short cold winters. The city experiences five seasons: summer, monsoon, autumn, winter and spring.

SUMMERS

Mid April to end of July

The summer in Delhi is characterized by extreme heat due to overhead sun, low humidity and very hot winds. End May is the hottest period in Delhi when temperatures cross 45 degrees celsius. Always carry bottled water for regular hydration, avoid direct exposure to the sun for long periods and wear light cotton clothing. But there is an upside: local Indian beverages like fresh lemonade, watermelon juice and lassi help you to beat the heat, and this is also the season for the king of fruits - the mango. There are also many options for weekend getaways to cooler parts of the country!

MONSOONS August through September

Monsoon winds arrive in Delhi in the month of July; the dates and duration of this season vary from year to year and are marked by high humidity, dark clouds, grey skies, incessant rain and high heat levels. Be prepared to witness roads clogged with water and disruption in civic amenities. Invest in an umbrella and mosquito repellant and ensure that your home has good air-conditioning. The monsoon season usually ends in September.



AUTUMN

October to November

October beckons the arrival of Autumn. This is a short, dry season with |warm days and pleasant evenings, and soon one begins to feel the 'nip in the air.' By November, winter is around the corner!



By mid December, it becomes cold as the chilly Himalayan winds begin sweeping the northern plains. The minimum temperate can drop to as low as 4 degrees celsius and often there is dense fog. Homes in Delhi are usually not heated and so you would have to arrange room heaters and suitable winter clothing. This much looked-forward to season is characterized by active socializing, weddings and festivity.

SPRING

Mid February to Mid April

Clear blue skies, warm days, cool nights, blooming flowers in natural surroundings...all these make spring the most delightful period of the year in the capital. It's a time for heritage walks in the meandering lanes of old Delhi, for exploring the city's gardens and monuments, and for exciting bazaar sales and exhibitions.





CUISINE

Cuisine is where Delhi shows its true cosmopolitan face – and palate! Popular street foods (tandoori kebabs and chole bhature, paranthas and biryanis), Bengali delicacies (sandesh and a bustling fish and seafood market), Udipi sambhar-dosa and the much-loved 'Chinese' noodle mobile vans co-exist with Italian, French, Mexican and Far Asian eateries that fortunately have begun to cater to a variety of budgets.

The staple snack for any authentic Delhi-wala remains 'chaat' – a spicy mix of pickled vegetables served with crisp papri. Even so, global fast food enterprises (KFC, McDonalds) have made their presence felt by adapting well to Indian taste buds. Nirulas – the country's first and long-running fast food chain serving a range of homegrown burgers and pizzas – continues to have a loyal clientele.

The capital's choice of dining options are extensive. Some are listed below, but for more choices and recommendations, do consult the Delhi Food Guide (it has the most comprehensive listings including shopping tips for gourmet ingredients), Time Out Delhi (which regularly features new restaurants) and First City magazine (which promotes food festivals and most major food events through the year).

PARKS & GARDENS

Known as one of the 'greenest' capitals of the world, New Delhi's colonies are sprinkled with small parks and gardens which are maintained by the neighborhood welfare associations and its residents. Many of these green spaces have been upgraded in recent years by civic bodies and have walking tracks, benches and play areas. Some of the well-known parks in the city are also known to be home to a vast species of birds.

Here are some of the city's premier parks and gardens:

CENTRAL DELHI

Central Park: Located in the inner circle of Connaught Place (also known as Rajiv Chowk), this is a welllandscaped park right over the area's metro station and serves as a popular meeting ground for young people.

Mughal Gardens: Sprawled across six hectares of the Presidential estate, the Mughal Gardens were designed by Sir Edwin Lutyens. The gardens combine the formal Mughal style with British garden designs with canals, fountains, multi level terraces, flowerbeds and a variety of trees. It is open to public in the month of February. Lodi Gardens: Overlooking the Lodi road in central Delhi, this beautifully maintained garden is a unique blend of British landscaping and Indo-Islamic architecture. The gardens have walking tracks, shaded walkways, tombs of the Lodi rulers from the 15th century and a small pond; it is very popular with morning and evening walkers, birdwatchers and weekend picnickers.

Buddha Jayanti Park: On Ridge Road, this is one of the oldest parks of the city and was designed to commemorate the 2,500th anniversary of the enlightenment of the Buddha. The park is an oasis of tranquility in the city for walkers, relaxation and picnics.

The Zoological Park: Near the Purana Qila (Old Fort) in central Delhi. This unique space is spread over more than 180 acres, houses over 1,600 animals, local and migratory birds and attracts upto three million visitors a year.

Children's Park: Near India Gate, the park has a variety of swings and equipment for toddlers and children. The park is generally packed with children during the cooler months of the year. **Nehru Park:** Spead over 85 acres within Chanakyapuri in central Delhi, the park has generous walking tracks amidst an undulating landscape and mature tree line. Popular with picnickers and young couples, the park hosts art events and concerts.

SOUTH DELHI

Deer Park: A lovely expanse of green nestled in the Hauz Khas area, this park boasts of a variety of trees and plants besides being home to a herd of deer, rabbits, guinea pigs and many species of birds. The parks shaded walkways are popular with morning and evening walkers throughout the year. The park is connected to the ancient Hauz Khas lake and the rose garden which together make up the 'green lung of South Delhi'.


The Garden of the Five Senses : Located in the village of Said-ul-Ajaib, off the

Mehrauli Badarpur road. Spread over 20 acres, it has formal gardens, lily ponds, bamboo courts, sculptures and quaint, cobbled pathways. Delhi Tourism takes credit for this lovely space, designed to stimulate the five senses and offering a spectacular view of the city.

The Aravali Biodiversity park: Located between Jawaharlal Nehru University, Mehrauli- Mahipalpur Road, National Highway-8 and Vasant Vihar, the park spans over an area of 692 acres and is characterized by a rugged and undulating landscape with outcrops of rocky slopes dotted with scrup vegetation and Kikar trees. The area offers habitat to many species of trees, aquatic vegetation, birds and butterflies.

LANGUAGE

The Hindi language is written in the Devanagari script which has distinctive bars running across the top of its characters. These are also used in Sanskrit and Punjabi which follow the related Gurmukhi script. Urdu, mostly spoken in old Delhi, uses a flowing Persian script.



Advice from Culturewise

- 1. Delhi Timing: In Hindi the word tomorrow and vesterday are the same word (kal). This could indeed be interpreted as a comment on the India attitude to time. The abbreviation IST, which stands for Indian Standard Time is often referred to as Indian Stretchable Time! Be prepared for a lot of flexibility in meetings. People might be late for meetings without informing and meetings can easily be changed to another time. Always arrange to reconfirm a 'confirmed appointment' - a few hours in advance.
- Delhi language: Most Delhi-ites are more unlikely to say NO than Westerners. Delhi-ites consider a direct refusal as being harsh and rude. You would have to learn the art of reading between the lines which communication with people in Delhi. A hesitation, avoidance of question, an 'I shall try' or 'may be' can often mean a 'NO'.
- The Head Wobble: A lot of westerners become confused when they experience the Indian head wobble. This movement of the head from one side to the other does NOT mean 'no',

even though this is the obvious interpretation from a western cultural perspective. The meaning of the head wobble is ' I am listening', 'ok' or yes.!

4. Delhi Hierarchy: This is a complex maze of multiple hierarchies defined by age, seniority, gender, income, caste and class and its understanding requires a deeper insight into Delhi culture. In order to understand this complex maze, it may be advisable to attend at least a basic lesson on cultural adjustment.

ENTRY INTO INDIA

Overview

Foreign entities can enter into India as a foreign company by setting up {Liaison office (LO), Branch Office (BO) or Project Office (PO)} or as a domestic company {by setting up Wholly Owned Company or Joint Venture with Indian Partner by investing directly into India}. Permissible activities for LO, PO and BO are defined under the Foreign Exchange Management Act; for example, an LO can explore and gather market intelligence to promote the product of its parent company but cannot undertake industrial, commercial or trading activity. Hence an approval is required from the Indian Federal Bank (Reserve Bank of India) before setting up an LO, BO or PO.

Foreign Companies can also invest in India by the setting up of a private/ public limited company under the Indian Companies Act 1956, thereby forming a Wholly Owned Company or Joint Venture with Indian Partner. Foreign Direct Investment is permitted in all sectors except a few, such as Atomic Energy, Lottery Business and Agriculture. Within permissible sectors, investment can come via an automatic route or prior government approval. Currently, most of the sectors are covered under the automatic route and hence foreign companies need no approval to invest in India (although they need to intimate the Reserve Bank of India of the investment made in the country). A few sectors such as Insurance, Defence (equipment) and Finance need prior approval of the Government of India and have an investment cap.

Foreign Companies (LO/BO/ PO) are taxed @ 41.2%* of profits whereas foreign companies investing by way of Wholly Owned Company/Joint venture are taxed @ 30.9%* of profits since they are categorized as domestic companies. Additionally, if a domestic company declares dividend to its shareholders, an additional tax by way of Dividend Distribution Tax is levied @ 16.2225%*. Hence it is important to consult an expert for advice on the best capital structure to reduce the effective tax rate to the foreign company. One of the ways of reducing the effective tax rate is through investing into India by way of Compulsory Convertible Debentures. However, it is important to ensure that all compliances are met while doing this.

SEARCHING FOR A HOME IN DELHI

Location! Location! Location!

Where to live will probably be the most important consideration in your hunt for a home. Real estate in the capital is expensive, but it's possible to get value for money due to availability of various types and sizes of housing (unlike, say, in Mumbai where there is an acute paucity of space and rates spiraling out of control).

South Delhi in particular offers good civic amenities, parks and shopping centers within or near its residential colonies. Then there are other elements to consider: Are you able to commute easily and quickly to your place of work? Will your home come with a garden and acceptable natural light? Do you have live-in staff that must be provided with their own housing space within or attached to your home? Is it a must that you have individual parking space for your vehicle? Is it important that you have comfortable access to a pre-school or hospital or fitness centre? And if renting, can you be sure of a smooth relationship with your landlord?

Involve your DSC (Destination Service Consultant) or an experienced realtor in your home search from the very beginning. It's important that you get the right information on all options available to you, spend considerable



time on physical research and strike the best deal possible.

Types of Housing

Homes with gardens: An attractive option, as a garden can be managed at nominal cost and gardeners (malis) easily hired. Be cautious about a garden apartment on the ground floor, as these homes often have poor natural light and the garden itself may lack privacy. These are a preferred by families with small children.

Note: Homes with gardens/yards were common until the 1980s. Now, many houses with gardens are being converted to apartment units and the garden is often remodeled into a parking facility (the Delhi Master Plan allows homeowners to build an extra floor in their compound if interior parking is provided to all tenants in the building).

Homes with terraces: Top floor or split-level homes with terraces (independent or sometimes shared) usually have great light, maximum privacy and little noise. However, it can get hot in the summer and the cost of electricity can be upto 20 per cent higher than that of lower floors! You have the option of building a temporary bamboo terrace shade and HOME SEARCH

overall, a terrace is an advantage for relaxing and entertaining. These are a favourite of French, Spanish and Australian expatriates.



The Barsati: This is typically a one or two bedroom flat on the second or top floor, with a large terrace space at the same level. Most barsati's were built under old building bye-laws, when Delhi home owners could construct only two and half storey buildings and no more. Present day building laws allow increased covered area, so the barsati is guickly disappearing from the city scape. This is a pity, as the barsati is a living space typical to Delhi and popular amongst students, young couples and single professionals.

Independent floors: This is a selfcontained home spread across a full floor of a building. It offers a living/ dining room, 2-5 bedrooms, a kitchen, a staff guarter and often a balcony. It's a popular and relatively affordable housing option.

Luxury apartments: 'Luxury' in Delhi's real estate jargon implies modern interior features, such as Italian marble flooring, designer kitchens, bathrooms with international quality fittings (often

including a jacuzzi), elevators and power back-up. These apartments are popular with expats from Japan, Korea and Western Europe.

Independent house / villa / bungalow: These are suitable homes for top-level management or diplomats who move to India with families. There is space for a private garden, a garage or two and large staff quarters. Living in an independent house is expensive and there is much reliance on domestic help and security services. There are very few Independent houses and bungalows left in the city today since most home owners prefer to convert them into multiple apartments.

Farm houses: Spread over one to three acres of land, the Delhi farm house comes with large rooms and living spaces and often, a swimming pool/tennis courts on its sprawling grounds. Be warned of the downside: you will need full time house help including cleaners, gardeners, security services, expensive infrastructure (generators and voltage stabilizers) and independent transport, as farm houses tend to be on the city's outskirts or in otherwise secluded areas. Overall, civic amenities even in these areas may be poor (as farm houses are built on agricultural land) but most modern-day farm houses have developed into clusters of gated communities for better security and facilities. Some popular ones in the southern and western parts of Delhi are West End Greens, Kapashera, DLF Chattarpur, Vasant Kunj, Sultanpur and Sainik Farms. These are popular with German, French, Scandinavian and American expatriates

Classified Advertisements in newspapers and magazines provide a limited choice of residential accommodation, and realty websites often list outdated information. Connect with your DSC (Destination Service Consultant) or a trusted realtor and draw up a list of needs, preferences and housing budget.

Based on this, your DSC will interact with multiple listing agents and shortlist suitable options for you to visit. Once you have made a choice, your DSC will assist you in lease negotiations and contracts and also help you settle into your home and locality. You may also, of course, contact real estate agents directly. But do keep in mind that your DSC will come with certain benefits:

- Saving time and energy: With a DSC, you will not have to make multiple calls or explain your needs over and over to different estate agents.
- Exclusive representation: Your DSC will work solely for you and provide objective advice on properties listed through multiple estate agents. Estate agents may push you to accept housing that is proposed/ listed by them and which may not be entirely suitable to you.

Your DSC will provide comprehensive support in your home search and settling in and will offer the following services:

• Conducts a need analysis and shortlist properties that meet your needs, expectations and budget.

 Accompanies you on home visits of suitable properties listed by several listing agents.

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WHERE TO LIVE FINEST NEIGHBOURHOODS WITHIN THE INNER RING ROAD

CHANAKYAPURI – DIPLOMATIC ENCLAVE

Chanakyapuri ('the city of Chanakya') is named after the 3rd century BC emperor. Today, this lush, landscaped expanse of prime real estate represents the diplomatic district of the capital. It also offers the best international schools, several of the city's oldest and finest 5-star hotels and top civic amenities for its affluent residents.

Houses and apartments are found in 'crescents' around Malcha Marg and Rajdoot Marg, with each property overlooking a green belt. Plot sizes vary from 300 to 800 square yards and residences from 1,600 square feet to 3,000 square feet. 

Gated farm house complexes in West End Greens, Chattarpur and Vasant Kunj are attractive residential location for people looking for peace, privacy, greenery, fresh air and large format living spaces. Most farm houses are built on plot sizes ranging from



1 acre to 3 acres with sprawling gardens, landscaping, swimming pools and facilities like tennis courts, play areas and kitchen gardens. The built-up spaces are characterized by generous entrance lobbies, theme based architecture, spacious living areas, separate dining rooms and extra large kitchens with built-up areas ranging from 5000 to 20,000 square feet.

OFFICE SEARCH

Looking for office space in Delhi? The city's central business district (CBD) in and around Connaught Place offers office space (Grade A & B) to many well-known Indian and international companies, particularly banks, airlines, insurance companies and financial institutions.

As a response to growing demand for commercial space in the city, recent years have seen the development of modern commercial complexes and stand-alone commercial buildings in Jasola, Saket, Vasant Kunj and Nehru Place, offering both retail and office space to local and international companies. The recent master plan of Delhi has notified select streets in New Delhi as commercial or mixed land use, adding to the supply of commercial space in the city. Demand constantly outstrips supply and this makes office space in Delhi expensive.

Yet, there is space for almost every business in the city – with varying

price points! Fresh start-ups and limited budget enterprises often find commercial space in Delhi's urban villages like Shahpur Jat, Masjid Moth and Khirkee village at relatively reasonable rates. Self-employed professionals (doctors, lawyers, architects) are allowed to work from their residence (home office) in the city, subject to certain legal restrictions.

However, the city is unable to accommodate large format corporations requiring, for example, over 25,000 square feet of office space. Many large multinational corporations, call centers and large companies prefer to move to Gurgaon and Noida, due to availability of suitable spaces and a relative price advantage.

Many new entrants to the city use the services of fully-furnished offices and then start looking for formal offices that meet their exact requirements. Here are some well-known options for serviced office spaces in the city:

Points to remember:

- 1. When finalizing the selection of your home, check that your residence has a separate electric meter or sub-meter.
- Remember to note the 'sanctioned electricity load' for the property. Ask your DSC if the power load is adequate for your needs.
- 3. The billing cycle for electricity may not coincide with the date of lease commencement. Remember to record the electric meter reading at the time of taking possession of your property and pay your proportionate share for the first electric bill.

- 4. The voltage is subject to fluctuation. It is advisable to use UPS system for computers and other expensive/ imported electronic devices.
- 5. Advise your children and house staff to conserve electricity whenever possible.
- Beware of electricity theft! One safeguard is to occasionally switch off all appliances in your home and see if the electric meter is running.

Overview

The water supply in most of south and central Delhi is considered acceptable for bathing purposes. Do NOT drink tap water directly. Most homes use a suitable filtration process (or reverse osmosis equipment) for clean drinking water. However, many expatriates still prefer to buy bottled water in 20 litre plastic drums for drinking purposes in their homes. If on the go, bottled water is available all over the city.

Charges

The DJB's charges for water have increased recently, but are still a minor component of the utility expenses. Approximate monthly water charges are about Rs. 500/- per person.

Points to remember

Upon shortlisting your home, please check the following:

- The location of the underground tank.
- Ask whether the underground tank is common to the entire building or exclusive for your apartment.
- The location of the overhead tank. Confirm its dimensions and whether it is exclusive for your apartment.
- The condition of the water tanks. Ensure that both tanks have been cleaned prior to your moving into the property.
- The location of the water pump and operating switch. Ask if it is

manually operated or automatic.

- Water pressure. Physically check the pressure in all showers and taps of your property.
- Water bills. Please ensure that you have a copy of a previous water bill to check on past monthly charges and payments.

Drinking Water

The most convenient option for obtaining quality water is by installing a water purifier/reverse osmosis (RO) system in your kitchen. The filters would need to be changed at least once in four months or as recommended by the supplier. The other option is to buy bottled water that typically comes in 20 litre plastic drums.

COOKING GAS

Overview

Indraprastha Gas Limited provides piped gas to select neighborhoods in Delhi. A majority of Delhi homes still rely on bottled gas/ cylinders which tenants have to apply for. The three service providers for bottled gas/ cylinders in Delhi are:

- Indane Gas Service
- HP Gas Service
- · Bharat Gas Service

Quality

Indraprastha Gas Service has so far been providing good quality piped gas and service at very reasonable cost. Most consumers for piped gas are happy. However, many neighbourhoods do not offer piped gas and rely on bottled gas. Unfortunately, the process for bottled gas connection application is tedious and can take upto 45 days. So it is prudent to apply for a connection as soon as your lease contract is signed and you have a proof of residence in Delhi.

Once you have a connection for bottled gas, you will be given a 'consumer number'. You can call your gas agency by phone for a refill bottle by quoting your consumer number. Since there may be delay in the delivery of gas



bottles, it's wise to purchase a spare cylinder which may be kept in storage.

Ask your DSC for the following:

- 1. The closest gas agency to your neibourhood
- 2. The documentation and process for application for your bottled gas connection.
- 3. Assistance in application and procurement of a gas connection.

Points to remember:

- In case your neighbourhood/ residence does not have piped gas, apply for a gas bottle connection as soon as you have a signed lease agreement/ proof of residence.
- Apply for two bottles so that you have a stand-by filled bottle at all times. It may take 2-3 working days for the refill to arrive, upon your calling the gas agency.
- Arrange to turn off the gas bottle/ regulator knob at night for safety if your bottle/cylinder is placed inside the kitchen.
- Should you suspect a leak, turn the regulator knob off and call for help immediately.



Do I really need home help?

Delhi homes need cleaning, dusting and mopping on a daily basis. Allied chores such as cooking, laundry/ ironing and all-round housekeeping are often delegated to domestic staff. Unlike in the West, domestic help is a full-fledged cottage industry in India, with part-time and live-in staff readily available at a range of salaries:

Housekeeper

Dusting, Cleaning, Mopping, Laundry, Ironing Rs. 8,000-12,000

Works all days excepts weekends for 4-6 hours, can understand basic English instructions

All-rounder/ Housekeeper

Dusting, Cleaning, Mopping, Laundry, Ironing, Basic Cooking, Grocery Shopping Rs. 10,000-15,000 Can understand and speak basic English

Nanny/Ayah

Child care, taking children to school and play-dates, preparing snacks, night duties (when required) Rs. 12,000- 15,000 (For night duty) Rs. 100 per hour is suggested

Cook

Basic cooking/baking skills, grocery shopping, preparing menus and 3 meals a day, cooking for small dinner parties, kitchen washing-up and cleaning Rs. 12,000-15,000 (Works all days except weekends/Sundays)

Do I need to provide staff housing?

While most Indians prefer to hire live-in house help, most foreigners choose part-time or fixed-hour domestic staff. Many homes in Delhi are equipped with separate staff guarters for live-in help such as cooks and nannies.

How do I find house help?



FOREIGNER'S REGIONAL REGISTRATION OFFICE (FRRO)

What is FRRO Registration? Do I need to be registered?

It is essential for long-term foreign visitors to register with the Foreigner's Regional Registration Office (FRRO). Long-term covers any stay that is 180 days and more, and the label 'foreigner' also includes overseas citizens of Indian origin. Foreigners with different types of visas - student, medical, research and employment – come under FRRO jurisdiction and must be registered within the first 14 days of arrival in the country. The FRRO works not only as a registration authority but often resembles a police department in its mode of functioning! Foreigners must come in person to register, and thereafter, their movements in and out of the country are tracked. Upon registration, the FRRO issues a small booklet called a 'permit' document – this enables the owner to book air tickets and hotels at domestic rates and verifies the individual's right to be a resident of India.

Process

For Individuals (Non-Diplomats):

It's best to arrive at the FRRO early in the morning, just before the official opening time. As you enter, fill in your name and receive your number in the queue. Make sure you have all the documents and the requisite number of photocopies of each. Upon registering, you will receive the permit document. When registration has been done successfully, you will receive a small booklet, which is proof that you are a resident in India.

For further assistance, contact your DSC or a professional company assisting in FRRO formalities.

On-line registration:

Guidelines can be found on the Web: www.indianvisaonline.gov.in/frro. Upon registering on-line, an appointment date will be given to you for which you are required to appear at the FRRO in person.

For Diplomats and Officials:

Diplomats and consular officers assigned to India, along with their spouses and children, are exempt from registration on a reciprocal basis. This category also includes officials of the United Nations and its Specialized Agencies (many of whom are holders of the UN Laissez Passer document), along with their family members/ dependents. These individuals are also not issued a residence permit.

Required documents for registration

- · Registration form

- Marriage certificate (if accompanying spouse)
- Undertaking letter (3 copies signed by the Indian host/sponsor/ guarantor) along with a valid identity proof such as passport, election identity card, official identity card, PAN card)
- Proof of residence letter (3 copies of either electricity bill / telephone bill / municipal bill / certificate

of a municipal authority/lease agreement or any other valid proof of residence)

- In case you are registering yourself via an employment visa, you will need 3 copies of the terms and conditions of the contract of your assignment, including salary, designation and tenure of employment
- In case you are registering yourself via an employment or business visa, submit 3 copies of your PAN card or of an application made for a PAN card. Applicants in this category will also need to submit a signed letter from their company/firm/business undertaking in India, and mention the signatory's name, designation and contact information.

The FRRO must be notified in case of:

- Change of address
- Departure from India (at this point, you will surrender your permit)
- · Loss, theft or damage of permit

VISA EXTENSION

What is an extension? When do I need to file for it?

Indian Government regulations prescribe the application of renewals or extensions up to 30 - 60 days prior to the expiration of the existing visa/ residence permit. Renewals for most visas must be done in India only and cannot be done at a consulate abroad with the exception of business and tourist visa applications.

Foreigners are required to carry proof of residence permit at all times. Failure to renew visas in time will attract monetary penalties and in extreme cases, prosecution, incarceration and expulsion from the country. Foreigners will also be prevented from leaving the country without complying with the renewal requirements where necessary.

The Indian Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) has now delegated powers to the various FRRO/ FRO offices to adjudicate renewal applications without the need for a referral back to the MHA.

Applications are complex, often requiring police clearances, and mandatory documents include proof of tax compliance while living as a resident in India.

Visa Categories

Employment Visa: For foreigners looking to work in India. This visa is granted for a maximum period of 2 years, or for 1 year of voluntary work with an Indian-registered NGO. Please include proof of employment as well as professional and academic qualifications.

Business Visa: Aimed at industrial or business entrepreneurs who are involved in commercial activities or would like to explore or set up a new venture. The visa application must be supported by a letter of invitation from an Indian business associate and a letter from the applicant's company, both stating the intention and duration of the visit.

Tourist Visa: Tourist visas (for all personal and non-commercial purposes) are normally granted for a period of upto 6 months. Longer terms may be granted, depending on the applicant's nationality or under special circumstances.

X (Entry) Visa: An X visa is only available to the following people:

- Spouse and dependent children of a foreigner coming to India on any other long-term visa, such as an employment or business visa.
- · A foreigner of Indian origin.
- Spouse and children of a foreigner of Indian origin.

Unlike tourist visas, X visas are not subject to the two month gap. Therefore, persons of Indian origin should apply for one of these visas when visiting India. It's not possible to work in India on an X visa. However, X visas can be extended in India, and there's no need to leave every six months. Journalist Visa: Professional journalists, media officials and photographers may apply for a journalist visa which is valid for upto 3 months. Before taking up an assignment, they must register with the Press Information Bureau (PIB) of the Government of India. Journalists travelling to India for private reasons must also file an application for this category of visa, accompanied by a statement confirming the non-media related purpose of their visit.

Transit Visa: Visitors staying in India for less than 72 hours can obtain a transit visa; any duration of stay longer than this requires a tourist visa. A confirmed airline booking of the onward journey must be shown when applying for the transit visa.

Banking System

The liberalization of banks and the entry of major international banks into India in the 1990s has made the industry competitive, robust and efficient over time. While certain administrative procedures still tend to be long-winded, most banks now provide client-friendly services (such as Relationship Managers to help

How do I open a Bank account in Delhi?

Most banks offer a Non-Resident (NRO) savings or current account for expats who earn an income in India. The features and benefits of this account vary between banks, but as a minimum requirement, the account will provide you with products like ATM/debit and credit cards, cheque books, and services such as internet and phone banking. It's important to note that bank accounts for expats (NRO accounts) require a minimum average quarterly balance of 500 USD. This amount may vary from bank to bank, but failure to maintain the balance will result in a penalty fee directly debited from your account.

Prior to opening a bank account, please check if you have the following:

- 1. Passport and Employment Visa
- 2. FRRO document
- 3. Address confirmation from your employer on a letterhead/lease agreement
- 4. One passport-sized colour photograph
- 5. Foreign/overseas address proof (or government ID)

Always ask your bank of choice for a specific checklist, as requirements for bank account openings can vary from bank to bank. Should you have problems, ask your DSC to assist you.

Repatriation of Funds

Can I repatriate funds from India?

Most banks offer Outward Remittance Services (ORS), should you wish to repatriate your earnings or transfer money abroad. The RBI allows expats to remit up to one million US dollars per financial year for bonafide purposes.

In addition to general documents of proof of identity, passport and visa, you would also need to submit a remittance instruction to your bank (the bank has their own format which they will give you) and Form A2, the application for Withdrawal of Foreign Exchange, which describes the reason for remittance.

For international money transfers. you may use the services of Western Union Money Transfer and Moneygram. Their fees tend to be somewhat higher than those of banks.

Currency

The country's official currency is the Indian Rupee, abbreviated as INR or as Rs. The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) is India's centralized banking institution.

The rupee is subdivided into 100 paise. However, paise coins are no longer available. So, even if an item costs 50 paise in theory, the amount paid is always one rupee (if an item costs Rs.8.50, and you give the shopkeeper Rs.9.00, you will not receive 50 paise back, as there are no 50 paise coins)! Although old coins are still in limited circulation. they have no monetary value.

- Notes: 5, 10, 20, 50, 100, 500 and 1,000 rupees.
- Coins: 1, 2, 5 and 10 rupees.

It is always very difficult to get change in India, so please maintain a stock of smaller denominations with you.

An oddity that you will have to get used is the Indian numerical system. Globally, millions, billions and trillions are commonly enumerated with commas falling after every three digits. In India, INR 1,00,000 is not

a hundred thousand but a 'lakh', and written as shown with a comma after every two digits. A hundred lakhs corresponding to ten million - is called a 'crore'.

Once you are past the 1,00,000 mark, all counting is done in lakhs and crores. This can cause confusion, especially when referring to the financial statements of your companies and with international transactions.

Money Exchange

Major currencies are easy to change throughout Delhi and private money-changers accept a wide range of currencies. When travelling away from major cities, it's always a good idea to carry cash.

Although all major and budget hotels have their own in-house money exchangers, many local hotels use private money changers. These are usually open for longer hours than banks, are found almost everywhere and offer competitive exchange rates. Many private moneychangers also double as internet cafés, jewelers and travel agents.

Whenever you exchange currency, check your notes carefully to see they are not soiled or torn or stuck together with tape. In general, do not accept such notes, and if you get one by mistake, exchange it at a bank.

Are credit cards commonly used in Delhi?

Credit cards are widely accepted in all spheres of market and industry.

Can I find ATM machines in Delhi?

Almost all Delhi markets have ATM machines. If your debit card is issued in India, you can withdraw money from any ATM at no extra fee, but only for upto five transactions. If you cross that limit then you can only withdraw money from your own bank's ATM.

TAXES

Income Tax Structures

The term "expatriate" is an undefined term under India's Income Tax Act of 1961. However, the Act does state that non-residents will become eligible for income tax on any income accruing from or received in India. So tax laws which are applicable to Indian citizens are also applicable to expatriates.

Personal tax rates in India are progressive upto 30 per cent, along with the applicable education cess.

In India, the assessment year is the period of 12 months from April 1st to March 31st. Income earned in the period of 12 months immediately preceding the assessment year is taxed in the assessment year. Tax Filing Status

All individual taxpayers are required to file an individual tax return and are assessed separately. Some companies file the returns for expats, but if not, you can also do this on-line (for a service fee of around 40-50 USD) or appoint a Chartered Accountant (CA) to handle this for you. A CA is an expensive option, but will be a lot more helpful if you're not tax savvy!



PAN CARD

What is a PAN card? Why do I need it?

IA (PAN) card - Permanent Account Number is a ten-digit alphanumeric number, issued in the form of a laminated card by the Income Tax Department to any "person" who applies for it or to whom the department allots the number without an application.

All expatriates that move to India and who work for an India company will need a PAN card. This number is mandatory for financial transactions, like receiving a taxable salary or professional fee, opening a bank account and for the sale or purchase of assets above specified limits.

In no circumstances can two individuals have identical PAN numbers and neither can a person have more than one PAN number. If you re-apply for a PAN (in case your card is lost or stolen), you will get a new PAN card but the number will remain the same.

It is mandatory to quote your PAN on return of income and in all correspondence with income tax authorities. For more information and guidelines, please visit the following website for more info www.incometaxindia.gov.in.

How do I apply for a PAN Card?

Application for a PAN Card can be made on-line at www.tin-nsdl.com or through an application form (Form 49 A). The form can be downloaded from the website of the Income Tax Department: www.incometaxindia.gov. inorwww.utiisl.co.in/

The following items are required when applying for a PAN Card

- 1. Proof of Identity and address (passport or Drivers Licence)
- One recent passport-sized color photograph (3.5cm x 2.5 cm)
- Designation and code of the concerned assessing office of the Income Tax Department (which you will have to mention on the form)

Cycle Rickshaws

The cycle rickshaw or open rickshaw is cheap, eco-friendly and ideal for short distance travel, especially through crowded, narrow bylanes. These are found in Old Delhi, and near most metro and railway stations.

Auto Rickshaws (also called Autos, Three-Wheelers or Tuk-Tuks)

These open-sided three-wheeled automobiles have meters, run on Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) and provide a cost-effective, eco-friendly mode of transportation. Auto rickshaws will stop for you if you hail them on the street, or can be approached at auto-stands. While they have meters, most drivers do not use them and you may have to pre-negotiate rates before your journey. Also, fares go up at night.

The capital's gateway to the world is the New Delhi Indira Gandhi International Airport, situated towards southwest Delhi. IGI is one of the busiest airports in South Asia with direct flights to most destinations.

Buses

The Delhi Transport Corporation (DTC) operates the world's largest fleet of CNG-powered buses. These buses are the lifeline of the city's working class population, and offer inexpensive transportation and wide coverage. Red buses are air-conditioned and green buses are non air-conditioned. During the day, most buses will be packed and finding people hanging out of the bus is a common sight. Be careful while travelling at night; for women, it's advisable not to board a bus alone after dark.

The Delhi Metro

Delhi's pride – the Metro – is clean, comfortable and inexpensive. The Metro has six operational lines (besides the Airport Express) that travel throughout the city and connect to Noida as well as Gurgaon. The Delhi Metro Rail Corporation's stated mission is to cover the entire area of the city by 2021. Travel is via single journey tokens, 1-day or 3-day passes for unlimited transport, or rechargeable travel cards. Detailed fares and timetables are available on the Delhi Metro Rail Corporation's website.



Types of tickets

- Smart Card: Most convenient for the frequent commuter, these can be recharged at the Customer Care centres of any Metro station. Valid for one year, Smart Cards are available at a minimum value of Rs.100.
- Tourist Card: These are for unlimited travel over short periods. There are two kinds of cards; for a single day, costing Rs.100 and for a span of 3 days, costing Rs.250. There is a refundable deposit of Rs. 50.
- Token: This is for a single one-way journey. A token is valid only on the day of purchase and the value depends on the destination. Look up the fare for your destination station on the token table. The minimum fare is Rs. 8 and the maximum Rs. 30.

You are permitted to drive in Delhi if you have a driver's license from your country of origin and have obtained an international driver's license/ permit. This works well if you plan to be in Delhi on a short-term basis. The international driver's license/permit is only valid for upto 1 year and must be accompanied by a valid license from your home country at all times.

For those without an international license/permit, or those who require a new driver's license (with lessons), it is required that you apply for a local learner's license.

Applying for a Local License

It is suggested that you seek the assistance of an agent or driving school to assist you in applying for a local driver's license.

You would be eligible only if you are at least 18 years of age and have a resident's permit (issued by"FRRO" Foreign Regional Registration Office).

If you decide to seek the assistance of a driving school, you can expect to receive a learner's license within a few days. If you require driving lessons, you can expect about 15 days training time. You would get your learner's license shortly thereafter and a permanent license after 30 days.

Should you decide to apply directly through the Regional Transport Office you would need to contact your designated RTO zonal office (the zonal office is based on where your live). Contact the RTO Online License Help Line (Mobile: 9311900800) for assistance. Alternatively, request your DSC for support.

Do not Drive without

- A valid driving license
- A Vehicle Registration Certificate (see Form 23)
- A road tax certificate
- A valid vehicle's insurance certificate
- · A permit and vehicle's certificate of fitness (applicable only to transport vehicles)
- A valid Pollution Under Control certificate

Advice for the road

- 1. Mobile Phones: Using hand-held mobile phones while driving is an offence.
- 2. Seat belts: Drivers and copassengers on the front seat must be belted.
- 3. Dark glasses: Use of dark, black or reflective glasses in vehicles is not permitted as per law.
- 4. Pollution Control Certificate: Driving a vehicle without a valid PUC Certificate makes you liable for prosecution under Section 190(2) of the Motor Vehicles Act.

5. Wearing a helmet: Mandatory for all drivers of two-wheelers.

If a traffic offence has been committed by you, an officer has the right to:

- 1. Issue a traffic ticket and collect the fine on the spot
- 2. Note down the particulars of your license, and forward the details to a court for action.
- 3. Demand and impound your driving license
- 4. Inspect your vehicle documents
- 5. Tow away your vehicle and impound it

Accidents

Mishaps are common on Delhi's crowded, haphazard roads.

Here are some tips:

- Stay in your vehicle. It's common for a large crowd to gather, especially if someone has been injured, and for the crowd to run hostile.
- · Contact the police (dial 100) and drive yourself to the nearest police station and/or your embassy.
- · An injured person must get medical attention immediately. Drive him/ her to the nearest hospital.

Driving suggestions

Driving in Delhi is, at first, a manic experience for most newcomers! However, official traffic rules are quite similar to those world-wide:

 Do not assume you have right of way (on Delhi roads, this is automatically assumed by large-size vehicles, so be careful)

- Be alert Indian drivers often ignore their rear view mirrors
- · If lights are being flashed, it means you must move out of the way
- The car horn is used (often excessively) to indicate to other drivers that you are passing, backing up, turning or just trying to get ahead
- On roundabouts. people approaching do not necessarily give way to traffic on the right - pay attention here
- Drivers may overtake from the left and change lanes without indication
- · Watch for people and animals crossing the road unexpectedly - remember, cows are sacred to

How do I find a good General Practitioner (GP)?

Most Delhi neighborhoods have reliable GPs, many of whom work from their residences. You can easily obtain a list of names and numbers of GP's in your neighborhood from your DSC. doctors do not keep their patients' medical records on file. You will need to carry your medical files/ medical history to all appointments. It is suggested you keep track of all medication prescribed, and that you write down usage instructions (medication bottles/tablets here do not list indications for usage as they do abroad).

Health & Safety

Water

India's tap water is contaminated and unfit for consumption; it should be used only for bathing and laundry. Restaurants will offer treated/filtered drinking water, but it is better to order bottled water. Bottled water may also be used for making ice and in some cases, for brushing teeth. Always make sure the seal is intact upon purchase.

Food

'Delhi Belly' – the city's commonly known stomach upset that most newcomers get within days of arrival – is often due to contaminated and partly-cooked food.

Try to eat fresh, home-made food as far as possible. When eating out, avoid salads and raw foods, fruit juices (that are often mixed with water) and ice. It is best to cook and consume meat, fish and poultry on the day purchased. Also, it is advisable to avoid sea food in the summer months.

Immunization

Several diseases which are virtually unknown in many countries, do occur in India. Prior to the move, ensure that all routine vaccinations are up to date. Your doctor can advise you with additional immunizations like hepatitis and tuberculosis.

If you are travelling with children: Most international schools require documentation of immunization from birth till date of admission. Your child may not be allowed to attend school, if medical records are not in order.

PETS

Can I bring my pet/s from overseas?

As a rule, domestic pets (dogs, cats, birds) may enter the country but there are strict health regulations which must be satisfied.

The following documents are required for the import/export of pets:

- Microchip Implantation Record. India does not require a pet microchip, but this is strongly recommended prior to travel, nevertheless.
- Rabies Vaccination Certificate. This must state the pet microchip number, the date of inoculation and the validity of the particular vaccination you have obtained



- Health Certificate. A standard document that is filled out by your USDA-accredited veterinarian.
- No Objection Certificate (NOC). This is a temporary permit issued in India that allows pets to enter the country.

Do keep in mind that pets coming to India could catch infections and may feel uncomfortable in the hot climate. Flea and tick prevention is required. Summer heat stroke and dehydration is common. Please take the necessary precautions after consulting a local vet.

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
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
